RE-TOOLED RAMS READY

The Canterbury Rams have re-tooled in the off-season following the signing of former Tall Black Mark Dickel as head coach in a full-time role. Tonight they face their Bartercard NBL 2015 campaign opener, following an extended team build-up, against the Breakers Manawatu Jets, a side that also had a strong finish to last season.

The Rams have acquired former NBA player 6'11 Mickell Gladness, rugged Fijian co-captain Marques Whippy and do-it-all American guard/forward Kyle Coston to produce a strong defensive unit. There is no player in the Bartcard NBL that has put in more effort in the off-season than co-captain Ethan Rusbatch, and he will be keen to show his development under the bright lights. Jeremy Kench is back at the point and last month he and his wife Amelia welcomed daughter Zoey into the world so Jeremy now has two ladies to impress! 2014 Rookie of the Year Richie Edwards returns to give the team some depth. Canterbury's own Marty Davison has proven he is ready whenever his number is called, helming the Rams to a pair of late 2014 victories in the playmaker spot. Capable guard Tony Tolovae has followed Coach Dickel up from Otago to study in red and black country. NZ U19 and Otago Boys' 2014 secondary schools national championship youngsters Sam Timmins and Joe Cook-Green have also joined Canterbury high schools for Year 13 and give the Rams some more emerging talents. More members of the Rams squad will be detailed in future editions of Ramblings.

Dickel coaches in a similar approach to the way he played so well for the national team, with relentless and intense defensive pressure and Canterbury will try to dictate the action.

A key to the game will be the battle under the boards, with both sides having tall forward line-ups, and Manawatu had a strong offensive boards edge over opponents last year.

Despite losing the Waikato Pistons and Otago Nuggets from the NBL, there will still be 18 regular season games, with some teams playing three times rather than the usual twice. The top four qualify for the sudden death final four weekend.







Player Profile: Mickell Gladness



Mickell Gladness was born July 26th, 1986 in Birmingham, Alabama. He is 2.11 m tall and weighs 104 kgs. He played college basketball at Alabama A&M. In 2008 he started his professional career in the Netherlands. From 2011-2012 he played in the NBA for the Miami Heat and the Golden State Warriors, where he started. He has the record for the most blocked shots in a single NCAA game with 16 blocks!! Over the summer he played with the Townsville Crocodiles. Mickell will bring a defensive intensity to the Rams frontcourt, but we are excited about what he can do offensively as well!! Mickell is joined by his lovely wife, Adriana and their 8 month old son Cale.

HORVATH ANCHORS JETS

The Breakers Manawatu Jets are buoyed by the return of former Duke product and naturalised Centre Nick Horvath to man the middle. Horvath's return last year spurred the Jets to the strongest finish in the competition and they just narrowly missed out on the playoffs. Horvath leads a tall forward line including former Tall Blacks Jeremiah Trueman and Jordan Ngatai. American playmaker Brandon Jenkins is joined by Dion Harris in the backcourt. Brook Ruscoe is recruited the Jets after a stint with Nelson and Derone Raukawa was the MVP of the NZ Under 23 Championships including 44 points in the final vs Canterbury. Manawatu comes into the game after their season opener in Southland on Wednesday night. The Jets can utilise a big line-up with Ngatai in the 3-spot or Coach Darron Larsen can use a smaller quicker unit by bringing in Ruscoe.
